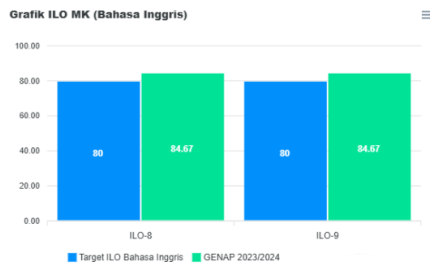

Analysis of the learning survey data shows that the English course is considered to have very good and satisfactory performance by students.
