

4. Analysis and Reflection

Analysis

Analysis of the data shows that the performance of the Entrepreneurship Course is at a very good and satisfactory level. Learning outcomes in all measured aspects have consistently succeeded in meeting and even exceeding the targets set. In addition, the performance shown is very even and stable across all learning outcomes, without any significant gaps between one area and another, which indicates the success of the comprehensive learning process in that period.

Reflection

This superior and consistent performance reflects that the course design and implementation has been very effective. There is strong alignment between the teaching process, the material provided, and the evaluation system, so that students are able to achieve learning goals very well. Therefore, follow-up for this course is no longer corrective, but focuses on efforts to maintain existing standards of excellence. 5. Follow-up Plan
