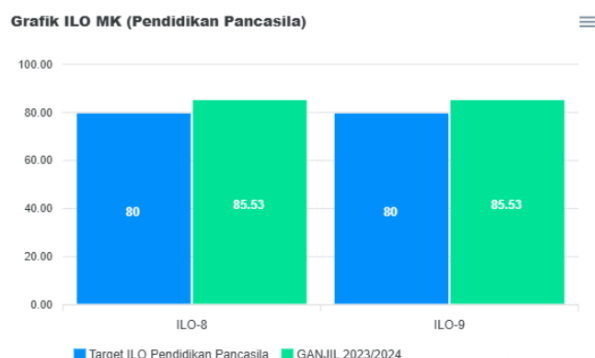

4. Analysis and Reflection

Analysis and Reflection

This graph compares **ILO Target Pancasila Education** (blue bar) set at **80** for both ILO indicators (**ILO-8** and **ILO-9**), with realization in the semester **ODD 2023/2024** (green bar) recorded at **85.53** for both indicators. Analysis shows that the realization achievements this semester significantly exceeded the target -webkit-standard; font-size: medium;"> set, with a surplus of **5.53 points** ($85.53 - 80$) in both indicators. The identical results (85.53) on ILO-8 and ILO-9 indicate that there is **very consistent strong** and high effectiveness in students' mastery of these two aspects of competency. The success of exceeding this target reflects the success of the Pancasila Education Teaching Team in designing learning and evaluation processes that not only achieve minimum standards, but also encourage deeper understanding and internalization of Pancasila values.

5. Follow-up Plan

Follow-up Plans should focus on continuously strengthening and standardizing these successes. First, the best practices used in teaching and evaluation that resulted in an achievement of 85.53 on ILO-8 and ILO-9 must be analyzed in detail, documented, and used as standard guidelines for the entire teaching team. Second, to maintain challenge and motivation, **ILO targets** for the next period can be considered for **increasing** gradually, for example to 82 or 83. This target increase aims to encourage continuous quality improvement efforts, rather than being complacent with current achievements. Third, teaching methods and materials that have proven to be effective in the Pancasila Education MK can be socialized and adapted by other courses that have similar characteristics in terms of instilling values and character.

6. Follow-up results on the previous semester's evaluation

The realization of 85.53 which succeeded in exceeding the target of 80 can be interpreted as **confirmation of the significant success of the improvement and follow-up efforts that have been implemented in the previous evaluation period**. This superior achievement indicates that if in the previous semester there was an unsatisfactory ILO, the intervention and corrective strategies implemented have proven to be very effective and succeeded in increasing student mastery far above the minimum standard. The results for Ganjil 2023/2024 are proof of the success of the self-evaluation process and implementation of changes that have had a positive and sustainable impact.
